The program is designed to create a "Culture of Innovation" and to prepare students to meet the demands of a rapidly changing labor market by creating their own opportunities. *Believe in Ohio* is a program of The Ohio Academy of Science and was collaboratively developed by Entrepreneurial Engagement Ohio.

If the purpose of education is to prepare students for life, *Believe in Ohio's* mission is to increase their engagement in the learning process through STEM and entrepreneurship. Students gain valuable insights into real life applications of the skills they're being taught.

Funding is provided by the State of Ohio with support from the Ohio General Assembly and Ohio Department of Higher Education. Special thanks to our legislative champions Rep. Jay Edwards, Sen.
